## HISTORY OF INDEPENDENCE DAY

Indian Independence Day, celebrated annually on August 15th, marks the end of nearly two centuries of British colonial rule in India. This day is a tribute to the relentless struggle and immense sacrifices made by countless freedom fighters who fought bravely to secure the nation's sovereignty. The journey to independence was marked by numerous revolts, protests, and movements that demonstrated the indomitable spirit of the Indian people, culminating in the historic day when Lord Mountbatten, the last British Viceroy of India, officially granted India its freedom in 1947. The celebration of Independence Day is symbolized by the hoisting of the national flag, the tricolor, across the country, alongside parades, cultural performances, and the singing of patriotic songs. The tradition of raising the flag at the Red Fort in Delhi was inaugurated by India's first Prime Minister, Jawaharlal Nehru, who unfurled the flag at the Lahori Gate on that momentous day, a tradition that continues to this day with the Prime Minister's address to the nation.

## **SCOPE OF THE PROGRAM**

The 78th Independence Day was celebrated with great enthusiasm by all the students. On this occasion, the NSS Unit of KSIT took the initiative in organizing the event. President Sri R. Rajagopal Naidu, directors from the management were present on the occasion. The CEO, Dr K.V.A.
